### HEALTH TIP

October is breast cancer awareness month and it doesn't just apply to women, since men can get it, too. The prevalence of breast cancer in women is 1-in-8, for men it's 1-in-833. About 300,000 cases of invasive breast cancer will be diagnosed this year and 56,000 non-invasive cases. There are 4 million survivors worldwide, but 44,000 women will die. Libba advised us to reduce our risk by doing annual mammograms and monthly self-exams. The risk of getting breast cancer is higher if you have other members of your family with breast cancer.
