Gary Chrisman gave us an overview of the Rotary Foundation and its importance to the world. The Rotary Foundation has operations in more countries than the UN and is the only charity with a perfect score of 100 and maintains a perfect 4 star rating. This means your money is effectively deployed. Unlike the Rotary International, the Rotary Foundation is a 501(c)3 meaning donations qualify for a tax deduction. Its sole mission is to help us advance the 7 areas of focus. These include water and sanitation, peace initiatives, disease prevention, food insecurity, education, maternal and child care and the recently added environment initiatives. The Foundation collected \$627 million dollars last year of which \$46 thousand came from our club and we have donated \$1,119,992 over the years.

During December our club will match dollar for dollar donations up to \$500. This means you donate \$500 the club matches it and you earn the Paul Harris award. If you are interested see Gary.
