dren. Michael has helped start two such clubs, as well as two Middle School clubs, and he expounded upon the benefits of membership for the children who participate.

A typical Early Act Club is open to children ages kindergarten to 5th grade, and they meet once per month for 45 minutes. Michael's own club meets in three different age ranges, but the older members sometimes meet with the younger ones to act as big brothers or big sisters.

At club meetings, the kids have snacks and do on-site projects for the school such as trash clean up, gardening, and other custodial duties, as well as making cards and other artwork for local veterans and senior citizens. Michael's clubs have also proven to be quite adept at fundraising for various local community needs, including spare change drives and food collections.

Michael also takes his club members on field trips to Washington, DC, and to other local attractions. His investment in his own school's club has resulted in membership growth from less than 30 kids to more than 140.

The key to a successful Early Act Club is to have a passionate and engaged faculty member at the school who can help coordinate with the help of a local Rotarian. Michael offered to be a resource for anyone interested in helping.
