OUR LAST PROGRAM

Dr. Yolanda Shields from the Shenandoah University School of Business spoke to the club about the benefits of internships and the positive impact it can have on your business. Dr. Shields has been with SU for the past five years after working for Vanderbilt University and recently she was appointed by Governor Youngkin to the State Labor Development Board. Workforce

Dr. Shields commented that Vanderbilt University requires students to participate in an internship program prior to graduation. She has a goal of instituting a similar requirement for SU students. Dr. Shields



notes that students participating in internships find practical applications for the knowledge learned in the classroom. Internships provide valuable work experience and in most cases give students a leg up in landing a job after graduation. Employers benefit from having interns by incorporating fresh perspectives as well as the latest knowledge while they build a pipeline of future workers.

Dr. Shields recommended that business owners plan ahead and implement a structured onboarding process for interns. She also commented that it is important to assign meaningful projects and offer mentorship feedback to interns. Dr. Shields said that most students are interested in developing networking opportunities as well as receiving pay for their internship. Dr. Shields recommended looking into the Virginia Partner Opportunity Project which helps employers with the expense of hiring interns for their business.
