OUR LAST PROGRAM Winchester City Police Chief Amanda Behan shared updates with the club. She took the lead position in October 2022 as the city's first female police chief and is still one of the 3% of police executives nationally who are female. Approximately 12% of the overall national police force is female, but Winchester's average is up to 22%.



Chief Behan grew up just five miles south of Winchester and credits her hard work ethic to her father and her willingness to put others' needs first to her mother. She said her staff are her number one priority, followed closely by the community she serves and protects.

One of Chief Behan's first orders of business upon accepting the job was to update the force's Vision statement and turn it into a Values statement, describing her force as "community-forward, officer-focused." She said her force used to be reactive but are becoming more proactive by establishing community contacts with groups like Shenandoah University, the Winchester school system, and Valley Health. Her goal is to head off trouble before it starts.

She cited traffic incidents around the city limits as an example, which she was shocked to learn averaged 90 per month. By focusing resources on the most problematic areas, that dropped to 70 with some months as low as the 50's. She also pointed to the increased use of Narcan to save countless lives from opiod overdoses. That led to a discussion on fentanyl, a highly potent (and toxic) narcotic that "is in everything now," according to Chief Behan.

She is also proud of her department's work with the local homeless population, most of whom have mental health issues and substance abuse; roughly 70% of the latter are due to alcohol use. The police force has helped get more addicts into treatment.

Chief Behan had to reduce her budget by 5% last year, which has made it difficult to increase the police force in preparation for projected population growth. She relies on the Winchester Police Foundation to fund community efforts like a K9 unit, the Kids and Cops at Camp program, and the Project Lifesaver, which uses chip technology to track individuals with cognitive impairment and at-risk children.

She credited body cams for keeping her department's "use of force" incidents to a minimum. (There were less than 30 incidents in 2023, and that includes minimal force such as holding someone's arm to lead them.) She said Winchester's police department has always been ahead of the curve when it comes to use of force and had already prohibited hazardous restraint techniques long before the George Floyd incident in May 2020.
