Julia Kogut and members of the Handley Interact Club made their annual visit to report on their service efforts for 2023 -24. Members of the Handley Interact Club's executive committee reported that 171 students contributed 5,315 volunteer hours at 215 different service



events. They estimate that their volunteer hours represent nearly \$177,000 worth of value.

The Interact club participated in a number of events that assist the Handley High School community. They also helped the community at large in numerous ways working with; The Rotary Club of Winchester, The Blue Ridge Wildlife Center, American Cancer Society, United Way, WATTS, CCAP, The Discovery Museum, SPCA, The Friends of Handley Library, The Apple Blossom Festival, Bright Futures, Froggy's Closet and SnowBusters.

The Interact Club members expressed their gratitude for the opportunity to serve and highlighted their participation in the Rotary District Conference in March as well as their service at The Apple Harvest Festival and with the Rotary Dictionary Project.

The spirit of patriotism and remembrance was strong this Memorial Day weekend as our club hosted its **4th annual Healing Fields of Honor.** Assisting many of our fellow Rotarians in the setup, welcome tent, and takedown tasks were large numbers from Navy Federal Credit Union and many of our beneficiaries: veterans from the VFW, law enforcement, fire and EMS. Neighbors from Winchester, Frederick County, and the wider Shenandoah Valley community proved hearty stock as they turned out...and remained...under menacing skies and occasional drizzle for both Thursday's opening and Monday's closing ceremonies. At each event, those attending heard first-hand accounts from veterans, both wounded by go-

ing in harm's way for our nation, on the nature of those that serve and what this weekend means to them. Both events also lent an ear to younger patriots: our middle school and high school essay winners who shared their thoughts on this year's theme:

"Our Heroes, Their Sacrifice."

Thursday's opening started early with veteran servicing organizations staffing tents along "Heroes Hill" in outreach to those who served our nation. Then, with a noisy arrival, over 30 motorcycles flying flags ended their memorial ride at the field and posted their flags as an event kickoff. Dodging some gnarly thunderboomers (pilot jargon) in the area, the opening ceremony crowd was treated to a C-17 Air Force transport jet flyover (that just happened to coincide with the Air Force song) and the arrival of two parachutist who slipped their way onto the wet grass and begin a "USA! USA!" chant. When we reconcile the final expenses, onsite/online sales, and generous support from our donors, we will report back on the profits for our beneficiaries and full appreciation for our varied and generous donors. In addition to the funds raised, it was clear this event (and the significant work accomplished by OUR club members) also served a meaningful Memorial Day focal point for our community. WELL DONE!
